



TSH PE and Sport Premium: impact statement 2016-17

The PE and Sport premium provided by the Department for Education is distributed by Hillingdon Local Authority to give schools additional funding to create additional and sustained improvements to the quality of PE and Sport by:

- Increasing engagement
- Raising the profile of PE and Sport
- Increasing confidence, knowledge and skills of staff
- Providing broader experiences

2016-17

In 2016-17 academic year The Skills Hub received £583.

The very limited amount of funding contributed to:

1. Heron Lake (Disability Water Sports Centre) Sports Day – this offers:
 - a. *The opportunity to take part in water sports/activities as a novel experience for many students.*
 - b. *Providing a knowledge and experience of sports/activities other than traditional land-based ones.*
 - c. *An opportunity for staff and students to gain water confidence and knowledge and experience of water based sports and activities together – a mutual learning experience.*
 - d. *An increased insight into disabled watersports activities in line with the school's equalities week that focuses on protected characteristics.*

As a result:

- Students' attitudes to learning and conduct, including significant reductions in bullying, across the school continue to show rapid improvement as students have developed an understanding and respect for each other's differences and are knowledgeable about the protected characteristics.
- Students are more supportive of each other and staff when learning new skills having experienced different water sports/activities together – a mutual learning experience.
